

Eric Brown Music Scholarship Fund





Eric Brown was an active, vibrant and wellloved member of Covenant Presbyterian Church. Following his sudden death in 2006, a scholarship fund was created to honor his life. Eric had a deep love for people and lived a life that quietly encouraged those around him. In his adult life he developed a zeal for music participating in church choir, hand bell choir and learning to play the trumpet. His legacy lives on through this fund, a ministry offered by Covenant, which gives oversight to its governance. The fund makes it possible for people to take music or music therapy lessons who are not able to privately pay the full amount. We are delighted to say that this year's students receiving music/music therapy scholarships through The Eric Brown Music Scholarship Fund have continued to benefit from partaking in on-line music instruction. In fact, music and music therapy instruction seems more important now than ever. During this time when students have lost so much; inhouse schooling, sports participation, hanging out with friends, going to church, etc. it feels particularly important to continue to offer the possibility of affordable music education and music therapy.

They continue to distribute groceries and work on repairing damage from the hurricane.



Broad Street Ministry – Thank you for the Hats – 300 have been prepared for Broad Street Ministry and an extra 100 which will go to Faith Ministry in Reynosa.

BSM is also in need of sturdy men's shoes and gently used men's clothing – especially jeans in sizes 32–40. These items can be dropped at the People's Pantry on Tuesdays from 10–12. Thank you to those who already contributed; we are pleased to have delivered one carload of items already.



Other News

The People's Pantry - The pantry is holding a canned food drive to restock their shelves. Bring your canned goods on **Sat. October 3rd from 9 a.m. to 12.** All types of canned vegetables are needed: beets, carrots, corn, green beans, mixed vegetables, peas and potatoes, baked beans, chick peas and red kidney beans. Also needed are soups of all kinds. Items can also be dropped off on **Tuesdays from 10 a.m. -12**. And thinking ahead to Thanksgiving – a large number (70+) turkeys will be needed for collection at the start of November.
